
So far this year, we have raised over \$1.63 million to support local students in need. With only 9% of these dollars going to our overhead administrative expenses and 5% going towards fundraising, we distributed the remaining 86% to the following programs:

As you know, COVID-19 flipped education as we knew it upside down. We adapted and rose to meet the challenges to the best of our ability, and we couldn't have done it without you.

With your support in 2020, we have:



Provided 15,000 backpacks full of school supplies, including headphones, face masks, and hand sanitizer



Distributed over
4,000 ageappropriate books to
K-12 students



Provided over 700,000 meals to families with students who rely on free and reduced-cost lunches



Provided training for 41 teachers to better educate students with processing disorders, including dyslexia



Supported the distribution of thousands of devices and provided internet access to 1,200 students so they could access learning



Adapted our Summer Shuffle to a virtual program serving over 75 preschool students and their caregivers



Engaged our Board of Directors in a frank conversation about race and equity in our organization and put concrete plans into action



Created a Student Academic Support Fund to provide supplemental tutoring and support for students struggling to learn in these difficult times.

Sylvia is a BVSD parent of two who works at a nursing home. This spring, her work hours were cut significantly due to COVID, and the financial impact was immediate. To make matters worse, she contracted COVID-19 while at work and had to take unpaid leave. Receiving food, internet access and learning materials from Impact on Education helped her family feel safe during this time of crisis. She was able to feed her family while she was out of work to quarantine and recover, and her kids stayed engaged in school. She's now doing better and back at work, but says she still relies on BVSD for affordable internet and meals to help fill the gaps from the hours she lost at her job.
